

Health and Immunization Record Policy – Student Health Center

Washington and Lee University

Incoming students to Washington and Lee University are required to provide a Report of Medical History, Physical Examination, and Immunization Record to the Student Health Center to establish a confidential health record for the purpose of provision of health care services while the student is enrolled at the University. Contents of the required forms, including immunization and tuberculosis screening requirements, are reviewed annually and updated as indicated based on the current American College Health Association Guidelines documents “Recommendations for Institutional Prematriculation Immunizations” and “Tuberculosis Screening and Targeted Testing of College and University Students.” The health records submitted by incoming students are reviewed for completeness, and the student is notified of any significant deficiencies during the first term/semester of enrollment. These deficiencies are to be addressed and resolved no later than the second term/semester of enrollment. Failure to resolve these deficiencies in a timely manner will result in a “hold” placed with the Registrar. Students must discuss all requests to waive specific requirements (e.g. request to waive required immunizations for religious reasons, etc.) with the University physicians.
